Session Highlights – April Session meeting

- There will be a Congregational Meeting during worship on Sunday, April 29 with the purpose of electing the 2018 nominating committee.
- Session will meet with the new confirmands for questioning at 9:00 am on Sunday, May 6th.
- Donna Houston will serve as Presbytery commissioner on May 8th at Calvert City Presbyterian.
- The Franklin Presbyterian Church Child Protection Policy was approved.
- Session will hold a Visioning Retreat on Tuesday, June 15 from 5:30-8:30 pm.
- A tree will be planted in memory of Kate Jones, daughter of Sarah Wakefield.
- Session accepted the recommendation from the Evangelism Committee to state: Seeking God, Serving ALL People.
- Session approved Franklin Presbyterian Church inclusivity statement presented from the Evangelism Committee to state: We affirm all people regardless of age, culture, disabilities, ethnic origin, gender, gender identity, marital status, nationality, race, sexual orientation, and socioeconomic status.
- There will be a church picnic (following worship) on Sunday, September 23, 2018 at the Lions Club Pavilion at the Jim Roberts Park.
- The 2018 church yard sale date will be September 15.
- Session approved a \$500 donation to Buckhorn Children's Center from nonlocal mission line item.
- Approved the collection of underwear to be sent to Buckhorn Children's Center.
- Proceeds from the April 28th Fish Fry will go towards purchasing new Bibles for the Cornerstone adult Sunday School class.

TARP Breakfast Raises \$1,460

Huge thanks to everyone who supported the TARP breakfast fundraiser on Saturday April 21. *Phil's Famous Flapjacks* were a big hit! Besides regular and banana pancakes, Phil introduced blueberry and strawberry pancakes this year. Diners enthusiastically approved!

The money TARP raised will go to FUND THE FORMULA for The Rhino Orphanage (TRO) in South Africa. This orphanage was the first of its kind, and formed in response to the poaching crisis which is still ongoing. TRO rescues and raises baby rhinos. The orphans are then rehabilitated and ultimately released back into the wild. TROs work is a critical piece of keeping rhinos from extinction. Currently they care for 21 babies, and their formula cost alone is roughly

\$300 USD per month. TARP will send \$1,800 to The Rhino Orphanage to fund a full 6 months of formula for the babies.

Due to the outpouring of encouragement to continue, the TARP initiative will not end after all. We will move our breakfast fundraiser to the fall to align with World Rhino Day. Our next breakfast will be in the fall of 2019. So for your support, your hard work, and your donations. **THANK YOU!**
