HYMN OF THE MONTH

Nothing gets a debate going like opinions on church music. Everyone has a favorite hymn or style that they like to sing during worship.

Beginning this September we will begin **Hymn of** the Month. During each of the coming months a "new to you" hymn from our hymnal, Glory to God, will be featured in several different ways. It may be played as a prelude, offertory, or postlude so that you can hear the tune. The choir may sing the hymn as a call to worship or offertory. Finally, at the end of the month you will get to sing the new hymn! Hopefully everyone will be familiar enough with the tune by then to join in singing. Franklin Presbyterian tried the hymn of the month idea back in the 90's when we adopted the blue Presbyterian hymnal. Some of the hymns that we tried turned out to be congregation favorites! Although they probably won't all be your favorite, our hope is that you will enjoy learning and singing the new hymns and please give us your feedback about this idea.

The hymn of the month for September is "Faith Begins by Letting Go". The text was written by Carl Daw in 1995. The music was written by composer Charles Gounod in 1872. The text affirms that faith is not a state of being but a process of becoming what we are called to be in relationship to God, other people and the world.



- Did you know that the order of hymns in the book follows the outline of salvation history, from Creation to New Creation. Hymns and songs for the liturgical year are sequenced in this outline from God's covenant with ancient Israel (anticipating the coming Messiah); through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ; to the sending of the Holy Spirit into the life of the church.
- Did you know that for the first time ever, PCUSA congregations have a choice about the color of the hymnal they purchase to put in their pew racks (either purple or cranberry red; for a small additional fee, a name can be embossed on the front of the hymnal, in silver for purple editions, or in gold for red). (Non-Presbyterian groups can also purchase 'Glory to God; in an "ecumenical" edition: same colors and contents, but no PCUSA name or seal.)
