#### Pastor's Portion

Timber cutters of past generations knew from experience that before they went into the forest the most important thing they needed to do was to sharpen their axe. Without a sharpened axe, the tree cutting could take twice, maybe three or four times as long to fell the tree.

For the last two generations our denomination has taken a valuable lesson from the lumberman's advice to sharpen the axe first. During this time, many of our churches have taken the time to sharpen our focus upon what God would have us to be doing in the future of our mission and ministry. Even though it takes a couple of months, more or less, to do this study, the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) usually has a lot better success in attracting the next ministerial candidates. The church's Session drives the process up to and until we have a PNC.

On Sunday, June 30th, our church's Session meets for the first time since Dot and I arrived. This is to plan our direction for the study and process for getting a PNC. After this next Sunday, we can tell you more about when we start what we call the "Mission Study" (our total look in ministry) and when we will have a PNC in place. It has been my experience that it is best to ask all, who attend worship on Sundays to participate in the "Mission Study" so that we can impart the very best sense of the congregation to pastors, who will be interested in learning more about us.

As soon as we are able to get a nomination process in place (Session), you will be presented with a slate of nominees to serve on the PNC at a called Congregational Meeting. The PNC will then assist in the continuance of the "Mission Study" and begin assimilating the information that has come from the "Mission Study", which came from you. The PNC, once they have a completed "Ministry Information Form" (MIF), will send the MIF to the Presbyterian headquarters where our information and preferences will be matched with candidates for a call, possibly ones interested in our church. They can also, accept self-referrals.

This seems to be a bit laborious task in one way, but it is an exciting time in another. It is a time that children, youth and adults can have their say. If you have ever said that you wish that someone would listen to you. Everyone has that chance and who knows, your words just might wind up in the introduction portion that tells pastoral candidates who we are as a people.

Jesus cautions us in Luke 9:62, when putting ones hands on the ploy handles to not look back, but to keep the focus on where the plow is going.
