Our New Interim Pastor

The Rev. Mike Chamberlain and his wife Dot, will be with us beginning June 1st as our new Interim Pastor. Both Mike and Dot, were born and reared as Kentuckians, with Mike being reared beyond Gold City, near Plano in Warren County on a dairy farm. Both are graduates of Western Kentucky University and they have three grown children and four grandsons.


After graduating from college, Mike served in the U.S. Army. Then during the intervening years before entering the ministry, he taught school, worked in state government, and later, in private business. He feels he felt most on purpose when he was elected and served as a member and chairman of the Barren County (Kentucky) Board of Education.

Mike accepted the call to ministry in 1974; attended the Louisville Presbyterian Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky and graduated with a Master of Divinity Degree in 1977. While in seminary, he added certification in hospital chaplaincy to his experience and training. The chaplaincy training has greatly benefitted his ministry, both in local congregations, which he has served and in his ministry with hospice and a head injury rehabilitation center.

Mike has spent over thirty years in what our denomination calls an Intentional Interim Pastor, serving several churches, both smaller and mid-sized. As an Interim Pastor, he not only serves in the traditional roles of a permanently called pastor, he assists the local congregation in identifying their strengths and call to ministry for the coming years. Beyond seminary training, he has added schooling and certification that has prepared him to serve in this specialized category of ministry for congregations that are living in the interim time between pastors.

He has observed that, had he and Dot remained in the regularly called ministries as do most pastors, it would have been much easier for them, but he has found it most challenging and full of purpose to journey with congregations, who are birthing the next generation of ministry.

We welcome Mike and Dot into our midst. Please join us for a potluck after worship on June 2nd.
