Pastor's Portion

Romans 8 speaks of "the whole creation groaning in labor pains". We ourselves, who live through this time between installed pastors "groan inwardly while we wait" for the calling of a newly installed pastor when we can feel like we are whole again. While we first think that calling a new pastor is similar to that of hiring a new school principal or a new plant manager in a manufacturing business, it really is a time of discernment of who we are together and what our vision for future ministry is for us that includes our discovering a new pastor, who brings ministry skills and interests to match the faith journey upon which we travel.

We have just completed the five week ministry study where the whole congregation has gathered to learn from each other and to offer our thoughts on what that vision looks like. Now, during the near future, the Session takes the next step of further fashioning our ministry vision. At this same time the Session is moving to offer three names from our membership to be elected to become our Officer Nominating Committee (ONC) at a meeting of the congregation in the near future. Once the congregation elects its three people to the ONC, they will join two Session members, who then become the actual ONC.

The Officer ONC nominates and presents to the congregation one person to serve as deacon and three persons to serve as elders to serve on the Session. At the same time they will nominate for the congregation's consideration, seven persons for the (PNC). With appropriate notice to all members, the congregation will meet to receive the report from the ONC and proceed to the election of deacons, elders and the PNC.

Once the PNC is elected, they will proceed to organize their leadership and then complete the Ministry Information Form (MIF) that goes to pastors and the computerized bank that contains all of the other church vacancies. The PNC will develop from the body of information that our congregational studies and other resources into the MIF.

They have questions related to our studies and our vision of ministry to answer and place within the MIF that all together comes to about a dozen pages. It is then submitted to the Presbytery Commission on Ministry through the Session for their approval that shows our readiness to receive candidates for ministry in our church.

Once the PNC is duly constituted and at their tasks, our tasks involve our prayers for their best understanding of God's will for their spiritual discernments while we go about getting "our house in order to receive guest pastors and prepare our spiritual lives to deserve a pastor that deserves us. Believe me. This is a huge task, but it can be done and all that each of us do in the process is worth it once the whole journey to a pastor is complete.
