# "No one can do everything, but everyone can do something."

Read this article by Guy Prall, our Room in the Inn Coordinator, to see some big ways FPC is doing what Jesus has requested of all Christians.

We had a spontaneous karaoke session one night. Another night there was dancing. Last week some of us invented stories using "Rory's Story Cubes". From January 1<sup>st</sup> to March 15<sup>th</sup>, every night, for twelve hours, from 6:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m., churches in our community take turns to host Room In The Inn (RITI). Host churches provide a warm and safe place for all the registered guests to spend the night. The evening starts with a family-style dinner, followed by fellowship, then cots and clean bedding. Franklin Presbyterian Church is also able to provide shower and laundry facilities. This week we were even able to provide haircuts for two of the male guests. In the morning the hosts serve breakfast before the guests depart at 6:30. So who are the guests?

Guests are those who have registered at mid-day that day. Beyond that simple requirement, there is a myriad of reasons as to why these "strangers" need a place to stay overnight. I say "stranger" because the first time they register they are strangers. But very quickly we are all on first-name terms. And, as you can imagine, after they have arrived and thawed out and eaten, conversation and jokes start to flow! We also offer refreshments at mid-day registration (nearly always accepted!). If we see there is a warm-clothing or footwear need we will try to meet it. Some of the RITI Board members will offer to help put guests into contact with appropriate services such as the Veterans' Administration, or help them acquire missing vital documents.

The original RITI program was started by Father Strobel in 1985 in Nashville. In Simpson County we started in 2015. FPC was a founding member and catalyst to get the program going in this community. That first year, county-wide, 11 churches and 223 volunteers participated in providing food and safe warm shelter to thirty separate individuals during that cold winter. This year, which has been warmer than normal, we host between 6 and 8 guests each night. At FPC we have had a wonderful response from this vital congregation of ours, wanting to volunteer and to donate money. FPC hosts on Wednesday nights. A typical hosting sees about eight caring individuals helping (setting up the cots; providing meals; hosting; laundry; take-down the cots). There are other opportunities, too, to help with registering guests at mid-day at the Willis House.

So why do I volunteer for RITI? I don't know if eventually I will be judged, as in Matthew 25: 31-46, to be a sheep or a goat; or whether I will just return to ashes. I do know, though, in the here and now, that I am blessed to have the health and family and resources that I do. Some other individuals are less fortunate. So, I have chosen to do what I can. And working together we can achieve miracles. Room In The Inn is about changing people, guests and hosts alike. It creates an environment with the opportunity for the guests to learn that there are people who care, and for the hosts to come to understand that the faceless, even invisible, figures on the street corners of our community are so much more than just a statistic.


