# Pastor's Portion

I have seen this written on our denominational website, www.pcusa.org : "Easter Sunday is something like the keystone in an arch — the top and center stone upon which all the other stones lean and depend — both in terms of its theological significance and its relation to other events in the Christian year. Theologically speaking, the faith we claim and the life we live depends on the affirmation, celebration and proclamation of Christ's resurrection."

Easter holds other celebrations and festivities on either side of it in place. We cannot celebrate the Transfiguration or Pentecost Sunday, each being on either side of Easter, until we know the date of Easter Sunday. This year Easter Sunday is April 12.

It is the Risen Christ that is our keystone. As individuals, we cannot fully know ourselves until we know Jesus the Christ. We, as individuals, make up one side of the arch that is centered by the keystone of Christ. Then there is the other side --- the Christian community. We begin to know more about ourselves and each other as we all come together in relationship with Christ.

Holy Week, coming up next week, sets the stage for Easter to be in our lives. So much of the symbolism, ritual and traditions of Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter seem to be ripped out of our hands and hearts, yet, our worship leaders for time, within which we presently travel are doing our best to present as much of these that we can online. Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter services are presented to each of us this next Sunday and the following Sunday on April 12. # God's Talent in Franklin Presbyterian Church

Throughout the community, Franklin Presbyterian Church has been known for its conglomerate philanthropy. The church regularly participates in groups such as Habitat for Humanity, The Good Samaritan, and Living Waters for the World, but unbeknownst to most of Franklin, the church has been doing even more for their community in recent years.

At the end of each year, the FPC Adult Sunday School Class participates in what is called God's Talent Project. It is a tradition that first began in 2009, and ever since has had continued support from the class. At the end of each year, the money collected in each Sunday School class is pooled together and split between each member depending on how many classes they attended throughout the year and used in their choosing of philanthropic work. The goal is to develop and encourage Christians to carry out what they believe God's work to be; walking the Christian talk if you will.

This year, the class had collected \$1,925 to distribute, with those who attended 40 or more classes given \$95, 20-39 classes \$80, and 10-19 classes \$46 to spend. In total, 27 members were given money to distribute as they see fir. A list of guidelines were given to each member allotted any amount of money: Remember this is God's money, invest in God's work, pray for guidance on how to spend the money, the money cannot be used to do anything illegal or obviously immoral, and by Sunday, January 19, 2020, turn in a brief written statement about how you used the money.

This year, the class has decided on a multitude of ways to assist not only in Franklin, but in an even wider radius. Ranging from contributions to the Boys and Girls Club, to donations for the Nashville Rescue Mission, to benefactions for the UNHCR. The project is also used to not just help larger
