Actively Engaged in the World

- 1. All Matthew 25 Churches across the country-over 850+-joined for the first ever Zoom meeting on June 10th. We heard stories from several churches and from leaders within the PCUSA. Many resources were shared, especially around Eradicating Systemic Racism, one of the 3 tenets of Matthew 25. Debbie Wyatt and Cathy Stratton joined this meeting from FPC.
- 2. Here at FPC, we have assembled a Matthew 25 Task Force to help us achieve our goals. Members are:
- Jane Rahm-with a focus on Eradicating Structural Racism. She is coordinating Zoom meetings with Wanda Tuck from Greater Taylor Chapel AME Church. These virtual meetings are called, "Let's Talk: Racism". Look for details if you are interested in attending.
- Meredith Halcomb-focusing on Eliminate Systemic Poverty with the Boys and Girls Club.
   We recently donated money to help fund the blue take home bags. Christian Service also donates money to the Boys and Girls Club. Check out their Facebook page. It is amazing how they are staying in touch with their students!
- Diane Stone-focusing on Eliminate Systemic Poverty. She hopes to begin a clothes closet here at FPC. This is a service that is much needed in our county. Look for more details later.
- Cathy Stratton-helping to coordinate in all areas of Matthew 25. She has helped with delivering supplies to a mental health facility, supplying face masks to many members of our community to help keep them safe, and too many other areas to mention!
- Debbie Wyatt-As the Matthew 25 Task Force Coordinator, she has focused on all areas.
   She is coordinating with Good Samaritan and has delivered food, towels, toiletries, cookware, and other requested items. FPC has been VERY generous with an outpouring of much needed supplies. Let's keep it up! She is also focusing on Congregational Vitality. Connecting with our members and encouraging them to reach out to our community is her main focus. Shortly, a large sign will be placed on the Kentucky Street side of the church, highlighting that we are a Matthew 25 church and that we welcome everyone.
