Matthew 25 offers an insight into the mind of Jesus Christ and a command about how to treat one another. Not only are we called to treat the least of these as we would Jesus himself, this is the determination for how we will be judged as true followers of Christ. That sounds pretty heavy duty, but it also is incredibly simple! That's partially why the Matthew 25 Task Force sees needs in our community and moves quickly to take action.

The Clothes Closet is nearly completed and ready for the first appointments for Franklin community members to get clothing they need. *When I was naked, you clothed me.*

The Task Force also donated funds for Simpson County Schools to buy manipulatives for the young students at Franklin Elementary. Matthew 25 also recommended that the Cornerstone be used as a Wi-Fi Hot Spot for SCS students (and a parent/guardian) during this time of distance learning. Session approved this action and if you would like to volunteer, contact Cathy Stratton or Debbie Wyatt. While there isn't a verse in Matthew 25 saying "When I was distance learning..." it certainly seems a good way to serve.

Education this past month involved Pastor Daniel attending a four-week course on Awakening to Structural Racism as part of the PC(USA) Matthew 25 Invitation, as well as Debbie Wyatt attending a seminar on Congregational Vitality. An action church is a stronger church, and a stronger church can serve not only our congregation but our community in new and exciting ways!

Session Highlights

AUGUST:

- Presbytery of Western Kentucky approved Pastor Daniel Van Beek's call to FPC and he has tentatively scheduled an ordination service in Michigan for October 11, 2020, followed by an installation service at FPC (date TBD).
- Session approved the Christian Service committee recommendation that \$500 be donated to Feeding America.
- Session approved Pastor Daniel's vacation and study leave weeks for the remainder of 2020 October 5-11, November 23-29, and December 25-31.
- Young Disciples reported that Youth Group kicked off with a pool party and will be starting on September 13 with meetings every other Sunday. Sunday School for Youth and Children will begin on Wednesdays over Zoom in September.
- Three elders will be rolling off of Session at the end of 2020, all of whom are eligible for a second term. The Session discussed naming a Nominating Committee by September.
- Session approved the Matthew 25 Task Force recommendation to donate \$500 to Simpson County Schools to provide manipulatives to kindergarten students.
- Pastor Daniel reported that Adult Sunday School will start later in September, likely on Thursdays to start.
- Pastor Daniel reported that a New Member's Class will start later in September as well.
- Fall VBS will be online over fall break and headed by Sarah Halcomb.
- Session appointed a group to work on policies and procedures for reopening worship.
- It was approved to allow the Cornerstone be used as a Wi-fi hotspot for Simpson Co. School students accompanied by a
 parent.
