From the Pastor's Desk

Boldly Leaping into Fall

What a cool moment we are experiencing, as if the chill in the air of late fall is already arriving as we just begin this autumn season.

There's a bit of "bold cold" creeping into our mornings these days.

This past year has seen its fair share of change at Franklin Presbyterian Church. We've experienced a new beginning, as God called us here to minister and worship with all of you. We've experienced a goodbye, wishing Pastor Mike all the best after his faithful service as our interim. We've experienced the rollercoaster of the pandemic, with virtual services, in-person worship at the Cornerstone, more virtual worship, and a return to the sanctuary.

These experiences have been bittersweet. We know that the right thing to do to stay safe isn't always the thing we want to do. We want to sing as a congregation, we want the choir to be back together singing as well, we want to be able to shake hands and hug and share meals together like we used to. Yet we also have been able to gather together once again. And begin to see the new reality we have, the new things God has been doing in our congregation.

Earlier this year, Session approved A Bold Approach, a plan that outlines the goals of connecting FPC more deeply with the community of Franklin. This includes carrying on with all of the wonderful ministries that FPC has been involved with for many years, like Good Samaritan, Feeding America, People Serving People, Boys & Girls Club, Living Waters for the World, and many, many more. And it also challenges our congregation to expand and enhance those but also develop new relationships and partnerships, new connections and conversations with churches, organizations, and individuals.

That "Bold Approach" has been our rally cry for 2020, knowing that new leadership would arrive and our plans can take shape for the future.

The future is here. Session recently approved a 2021 VISION Statement: BOLDLY LOVING GOD, BOLDLY LOVING NEIGHBOR. Based on the Greatest Commandments that Jesus tells us about, echoing what God told the Israelites in the Old Testament, this Vision builds upon the Bold Approach in a way that shines a light on our past and present ministries while keeping space open for new ones, while working hand in hand with Matthew 25 initiative.

More is coming from both Session and the Committees about how we will be living into this Vision for 2021. In the meantime, ponder these verses that inspired the statement: Deuteronomy 6:4-9, Leviticus 19:17-18, Matthew 22:36-40, and Hebrews 10:23-25.

Let us boldly love one another as God has loved us.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS-SEPTEMBER

- Session approved The Lord's Supper to be celebrated on October 4 using disposable pre-filled cups and wafers.
- Congregational Meeting is scheduled for October 18 to approve the Nominating Committee for 2020. Session appointed Cathy Stratton and Jim Sowney and accepted the appointment of Marcella Davis by the Deacon board. Two FPC members will be elected by the congregation on October 18. The Nominating Committee will provide recommendations for 3 Elders and 1 Deacon to serve 3-year terms beginning in 2021.
- Session approved pulpit supply for October 11 (Steve Thurmond), November 29 (Caren Gibson), and December 27 (Curry Davis).
- Session received confirmation that Pastor Daniel Van Beek's ordination service will be October 11, 2020, at First Presbyterian Church in Benton Harbor, Michigan, at 1 PM ET (12 PM CT). The service will be streamed on Facebook Live via the church's Facebook page.
- Session approved Fellowship events, including children wearing costumes to worship on November 1 (plus receiving treats), a farewell for the Timmermans on October 4 after worship, and a "tailgate" reception to celebrate the installation of Pastor Daniel on October 25 (date tentative pending presbytery approval).
- Session requested that the Matthew 25 Task Force begin development of the next Matthew 25 sign. Signs will be rotated quarterly. The current sign will remain until the next sign is produced.
