



SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

- Called a Congregational Meeting for December 6 in which to elect the Elders and Deacons for the Class of 2023 and where the 2021 Budget will be presented to the Congregation.
- Set December 20 as the Installation date for new officers.
- Regretfully and yet with immense gratitude accepted the resignation of Carolle Tracy as Music Director.
- Finance Committee presented a draft 2021 Budget.
 Committees will make revisions for Session approval at the next meeting.
- Discussed additional ideas for 2021 Vision of Boldly Loving God, Boldly Loving Neighbor and authorized that it be shared with the entire congregation.
- Approved the Cornerstone as a host for Room in the Inn Franklin for this winter.
- Discussed current COVID-19 protocols and the prospect of virtual worship returning due to recent case increases.
- Excitedly approved a partnership with Live the Proof (represented by Tammie McCory), which will provide free "to go" community lunches on Tuesdays and Thursdays, using the Cornerstone kitchen to prepare meals.
