### Pastor's Pen

#### Praising (and Praying) through the Pain

One of the most difficult parts of the Lent season for me is finding myself down in the doldrums of my own mortality and morality. Praying for a Closer Walk with Thee can often lend to lament of one's own past sins and a cry for help to our Savior and God!

As we continue our Lenten journey together by hearing God's voice in the Psalms, we see the psalmist cry out in ways that sound familiar. The difficulties of the situation, the enemies all around, the pain and suffering they were forced to experience. These might be things we personally feel or that we might feel as a community of God's people.

And as we reflect on this season of repentance, we can easily fall into a trap of thinking that we are worthless and beyond redemption. Yet that is when the GOOD NEWS of Lent comes to us, my dear friends! That our God loves us so much to send Jesus Christ to us, in the midst of our struggles, in the midst of our pain, and that God's own self experiences the same pain and turmoil that we do in life as Jesus walking this earth. Even more than we do, by suffering rejection and death on a cross!

#### What wondrous love is this? Amazing love! How can it be that you, my God, died for ME?

Alongside this journey of repentance and pain, there is another journey, one of prayer and praise. We see that in the Psalms, which can so quickly turn from fear to joy and from despair to elation. And we see it in the love of Christ, the pain of Good Friday, the anxiety of Holy Saturday, and the incredible joy of Easter morning!

Before we get ahead of ourselves and go along to the end of Lent, let us take a moment to see what our little congregation has been experiencing these past few months. In the midst of a pandemic, we have opened our doors to new or expanded opportunities and partnerships in which to seek God and serve all people. Room in the Inn, Live the Proof / Feed the Need, Clothes Closet, new conversations about kid's community activities, about churches working together, about listening to the needs in our community and helping in a way that glorifies our God and reflects our love for Jesus.

Praise be to God! The Holy Spirit continues to move and inspire us to be disciples in new and exciting ways, beloved! As we pray, let us remember to praise (even when we and our community is in pain). For this journey in Lent is one of difficulty at times, but we know where it is going. We know what awaits on that first weekend in April. Let us march along (all March long) in prayer and praise to our Redeemer!
