SEEING JESUS

SUMMER FEEDING PROGRAM-COMING UP SOON!

Summer Feeding Program – It's nearly that time of year again for FPC members to deliver lunches to hungry children around town. Beginning in June and continuing through July, daily deliveries will be made and volunteers will be needed. During the month of June, Linda Knight has agreed to be our coordinator for the volunteers. Please check your calendars for days you will be able to help.

Specific times will be announced later, but generally this begins around 11:45 each day, Monday through Friday.

"What does it entail?" you might ask. Two people arrive at the church, pick up the church van, drive to the school to pick up the meals (in coolers), drive to our designated locations, hand out meals and beverages to hungry children, drive back to the church to empty the coolers to dry overnight, and go home. All that takes is about 90 minutes of your time to make nearly 75 children happy!

Linda will have sign up sheets available by the middle of June. We are in need of a coordinator to oversee the first two weeks of July (the last 2 weeks are taken care of already!) The coordinator simply makes sure someone is there each day to deliver meals and should be ready to pitch in if the need arises.

Last year, we discovered that many couples found it worked well to take an entire week. Less likely to forget that it's your day! Please consider giving your time to make this program successful again this year. We've been doing this for about 20 years! Here's to the next 20!

Christian Service News

During the pandemic the Christian Service Committee has not been as engaged as in previous years, but we have continued to serve as we could. We provided meals in January and February for Live the Proof and served a meal to People Serving People in late 2020.

We have sent \$500 to Good Samaritan and \$300 to the Backpack Program from FPC budget allocated funds. In the April meeting, we voted to send \$1,000 to Simpson County Habitat for Humanity and \$1,000 to the Nashville Tornado Response Fund.

The committee also agreed to have the Annual Yard Sale this summer if pandemic protocols allow!

Have you noticed the clothes line hung on the railing on Kentucky Street? We started giving away hats, gloves, and scarves, and now are doing a brisk business with our sock giveaway. We have had many positive comments and are clearly making a statement about our passion for helping others.

The Clothes Closet has received generous donations of new clothing from Annabelle and Ashe Children's Store and new t-shirts from a business out of Louisville. We also packed up extra clothes and gave over 50 boxes to the Mennonite Clothes Ministry. We have transitioned to our spring and summer clothes and have given away over 599 articles of clothing since starting in late October.

On Wednesday, May 12 at 11:00 am, we will be celebrating with a ribbon cutting ceremony by the Chamber of Commerce. Everyone is invited to attend and a sack lunch will be provided. This new program has been a blessing to those who are helping as well as those who are receiving the clothing. *Thanks so much for the strong support from our congregation!*

Feed the Need Soup Kitchen continues to prepare lunches on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Tammie McCory, the founder, is looking for assistance in preparing meals. You can provide your own food, or work with him and he will make sure you have whatever you need. Just lending a helping hand would be a way for FPC to support this community mission. Volunteers will need to be there from 10 am-12:30 pm (or earlier, depending on the food for that day) and 2-3 people are needed.
