## **Our New Position: Community Connections Director**

Part of the FPC Bold Approach Vision, this position will focus in two main areas: 1) making connections in the community, across all lines of denomination, ethnicity, and faith so that we can participate more fully with other churches and organizations, and 2) leading and coordinating children and youth volunteers with Kids Club, Youth Group, Youth Sunday School, and any new activities for young people. Additionally, the position will coordinate tech volunteers and staff regarding livestreaming as well as working with staff regarding social media strategy to communicate about and with FPC to the community. The position is a full-time staff job, and as such is not an installed clergy position at this time. The key words for this position are communication, connection, creativity and collaboration.

## Our New Staff Person: Bailey Pickens

During the search, Bailey Pickens stood out in terms of ability, knowledge, dedication, and spiritual calling. Bailey is an ordained Minister of the Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and most recently served St. Mark's Presbyterian in Tucson, AZ as the Pastor of Faith Formation, while also serving in campus ministry at the University of Arizona and as a hospital chaplain. ## A Note from Bailey Pickens:

Dear Franklin Presbyterian Church:

Hello! I am so excited to join you all, and so I'm excited to write this note to connect with you just a little bit before I arrive in your midst.

I'm a cradle Presbyterian, and I grew up in a town about Franklin's size in Florida, in a family-sized congregation, where everyone knew everyone's name. I've lived all over the place, most recently in Tucson, AZ. My wife and I moved to Nashville at the end of July so that she can start a PhD in Sacramental Theology at Vanderbilt, and we are so happy to be a little closer to home: we've been Southern expats sojourning in strange lands for long enough.

I want to tell you why I am so, jazzed about Franklin Presbyterian Church: Y'all "get" it! Churches and their relationships to the world around them have been changing my whole life, and I'm sure you have all noticed it too. So FPC's embrace of the Matthew 25 initiative, your full-throttle approach to service, and your desire to know your community and the community's needs absolutely light me up, because I think this is how we should be! I've been hearing a lot about how you are being the church in an active, visible, and inviting way. I want to be a part of that!

The Community Connections Director role is a complex one, but I think there are good ways for community relationships, growth and fun for young people and their families, and online presence and accessibility to interweave with one another. I think they all connect fundamentally to the congregation as a whole and to God's call on each member and on the body. I am excited about things to try, and about the slower work of learning to be a part of a new community, both the congregation and Franklin itself, too. My prayer is that I will be a good partner and resource for this congregation in the work you are already doing. I can't wait to meet you all and jump in.
