Sessions will run for 75-90 minutes, but you can always leave early if need be. Snacks will be offered, and feel free to bring your own food! Childcare will be provided.

Workbooks are available in the church office and will be brought to the first session (there's no homework before Week 1). This seven-session study will be hybrid, and you can participate via Zoom. Contact Bailey with any questions!

Fellowship

We welcome Donna Houston and Nancy Thomas as the new Co-Chairs for our Fellowship Committee. They will bring new energy and ideas to this committee!

Matthew 25

Our Matthew 25 Committee just completed our very first year as a committee here at FPC. It has been a very busy committee with the following accomplishments:

<u>Clothes Closet:</u> We wrote and received a \$15,000 grant to establish the clothes closet and support the Feed the Need Soup Kitchen.

- During 2021, the Matthew 25 Clothes Closet served over 400 people and gave out almost 3,000 items of clothing. We have partnered with the following agencies to either give clothes, and/or receive their financial support Simpson County Health Department, Good Samaritan, St. Vincent DePaul ministry, Franklin Simpson County Schools, Simpson County Literacy Center, Hope Haven, Room in the Inn, The Housing Authority, and the Boys and Girls Club. Clothing donations as well as monetary gives from other churches and MANY individuals has made this a community program.
- We are sad to bid farewell to Cathy Stratton who is moving to Franklin, Tennessee to be closer to family. She has been the
 visionary and driving force of the Clothes Closet since its inception and will be great missed. Thank you Cathy for this
 amazing ministry!

Dismantling Structural Racism

- We purchased a variety of books on understanding structural racism for both children and adults. These are available for checkout in the Parlor.
- We purchased a sign that is displayed on Kentucky Street which emphasizes inclusion for all at FPC.

Eradicating Systemic Poverty

- Supported the establishment of the Soup Kitchen run by Tammie McCory of Feed the Need. We purchased several pieces
 of kitchen equipment as well as a deep freezer to support this ministry. Besides serving over 50 meals each Tuesday and
 Thursday, guests are able to pick up groceries received as part of Feeding America. Often, people are able to use our
 showers and laundry facilities on an as needed basis.
- Established vouchers for gas, food, and lodging for those in need. While mainly supported by the Pastor's Benevolence Fund, Matthew 25 was able to meet with businesses and develop vouchers so that a check does not have to be written immediately. These businesses send us a monthly bill for services provided.
- Established a food pantry in the old kitchen to give food for those in need of a hot meal or snack.

Congregational Vitality

In conjunction with Fellowship, Christian Service, and Young Disciples, we were able to finally return to potlucks, special meals, and other projects that reach out into the community with our members. We have always had strong ties to other non-profit agencies, but we have been able to reconnect with some after Covid-19 and add others with participation from our members.

What's Ahead?

While we will continue the Clothes Closet, several new projects are in the works, so stay tuned AND get involved with us!




