

If you have a chance to visit the Clothes Closet, you will notice some big changes!

- All the Children's clothes have been moved so that all items are together creating a "Kid's
 Department ". That left more space for a dedicated adult section. Several shelving units were moved,
 more purchased, and lots of reorganization ha taken place.
- We have a dedicated rack for fall clothing that includes Halloween costumes.
- Summer clothes are being packed up to make room for warmer fall and winter clothes.
- Thanks to Craig Kessler and Mike Wyatt, racks were moved, floors mopped, and tubs hauled up and down steps.

Donations:

- We continue to get donations of children's clothes from Annabelle and Ashe.
- Willow Hill has given us many donations of adult clothing.
- A new partner this month is **Simply Sweet Boutique**. We received adult clothes, some children's clothing, and a lot of women's belts.

WE also have gotten many used clothing donations from community members. One family even donated 17 tubs – all sorted by size! Thanks, Caren Gibson for delivering for a friend!

We never seem to have enough size 30-34 men's jeans, men's shoes, or underwear for children and adults. Check your closets, and perhaps pick up a package of underwear on your next shopping trip.

You may be surprised at how much we give away every week. Since January, we have served 746 clients (an 87% increase over previous year) and given away 6168 items of clothing (a 58% increase). We get a mixture or new and repeat clients. We are giving away more children's clothes than we did before and this was definitely true near the beginning of school.

Our committee puts in MANY hours every week and are always looking for new volunteers, even a day a month would be helpful.
