MISSION & MINISTRY BY THE NUMBERS AT FPC

Franklin Presbyterian Church utilizes four (4) ways in which to fund and operate the mission and ministry we do in our congregation and community. The largest is our annual Operational Budget, recently approved by Session for 2023 and presented at the December 11 Congregational Meeting. Supplementing that Budget is A Bold Approach (ABA), monies derived from the Clendining Bequest Fund. ABA funds are primarily used for ministry programs, including the personnel who run those programs. More details will come soon in a future Lamplighter.

Other ministries are funded through Designated Funds. These were established for such well-known programs as Living Waters for the World, Matthew 25 Programs, Clothes Closet, and Christian Service. Funds for each have been raised through fundraisers, grants, or donations. These funds are set aside for the programs to which those monies have been allocated.

The Pastor's Benevolence Fund receives its funding quarterly through specific investment dividends. The total is about \$1,800 per year. In 2022, due to the rising needs in our community, Pastor's Benevolence provided more than \$10,000 in assistance through utility payments, gas vouchers, food vouchers, emergency housing (motels), and other assistance. This was possible due to one large donation made in 2021 as well as some regular gifts by members of the church and the community. To be able to continue to help as much as we have, additional funding will need to be found. This could mean a new way of funding Pastor's Benevolence through our church investments, or fundraising programs, or additional donations.

One difficult part of doing ministry in modern day America is that it all costs money. Each of these funding sources is important for FPC to do the work it does in Franklin. The operational budget provides the foundation for our facilities and staff to administer ministry. The Bold Approach funding helps pay for new ministries and opportunities. The designated funds offer specific options for local and international mission work, while the Benevolence fund helps alleviate immediate need as we seek to Love our Neighbors.

Keep all of these wonderful things happening at FPC in your prayers and if there are new ways to help and serve, let us know! If there are new ways to help fund these missions and ministries, let us know! God's already been doing a great work in us, FPC, and if we keep following Jesus, even more great work will be done!

Finally, a community member who believed in what we are doing, donated 30 pairs of new Sketcher shoes.

These donations have kept us busy, but feeling blessed.

In 2022, we have given out over 10,000 items of clothing to over. 1,000 clients.
