## Rereading the Future

Do you ever like to reread books you've already read? (Say that five times fast!) I used to do this a lot more, but now I find that I'm often looking forward to new books, because there's so many good ones to choose from!

When it comes to the Bible, we might be tempted to skim or read quickly a story or psalm or part of a New Testament letter we've read many times before. We think we've heard this before, we know what it says, why bother slowing down if we already know what it says!

I used to be the person who highlighted and bookmarked key things in his Bible. Until one day I realized that I made a note once that I no longer agreed with. Or that didn't seem to make as much sense to me, or that wasn't as cut and dried as I thought. I can't truly remember the exact verse or the exact note, but I do recall that it changed the way I read the Bible.

Instead of highlighting or making comments that greeted me each time I reread a Scripture, I began to let the Holy Spirit work in my mind and in my heart anew each time. To fall fresh on me each time I read the Bible. Now I'm not saying that if you're a notes and highlighting kind of person that you need to stop! I'm merely telling you my journey.

But that experience taught me that what I once thought is not what I'll always think.

Even before I arrived, this congregation made a commitment to be a Matthew 25 Church. In fact, since I've been here, some folks have shared wonderful stories of how FPC was a Matthew 25 Church before there was any kind of designation for it!

And that is beautiful.

Some of the ministry we've done, the programs we've built, and the partnerships we've fostered came out of that Matthew 25 Vision for FPC. They tied directly into the Bold Approach thinking, the way God is calling us to use the abundance we've been given in our resources, our buildings, and our talents and time, to further the kingdom of God.

Now if we look back on what it means for FPC to be a Matthew 25 Church or to take a Bold Approach, how is it different today than when we first made that commitment? What would we do differently? How do we feel God is leading us to continue? Or to change?

This summer might just be a great time to reread our vision or our mission as FPC. To discern how things have been going, whether good or bad. To reexamine what we feel we've been asked to do as Christ's disciples in this world and in this community.

I encourage a season of prayer, as I am committing myself to, for listening to the Holy Spirit.

Perhaps if we listen, we'll collectively find God's call more clearly.

And I invite any of you to talk more about how you think FPC is doing in our ministry to our community, what you love, what you don't like, what you think we should be doing. What a blessing it would be to hear how God is stirring your hearts and minds too!

May the grace and peace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ be yours in abundance!


