As summer comes to a close, the Matthew 25 Clothes Closet continues to grow and serve our community.

About 300 items of clothing are given away weekly – on a busy week we approach 500 items! Another area of growth in Clothes Closet is in community support. Our recent "Christmas in July Undie Sunday brought in almost 500 pairs of new underwear. We also regularly have 10 church and 9 community volunteers. Some of our community volunteers are prior clients who feel moved to give back and have been a big blessing.

We will likely do another underwear drive in December. We have several churches who have requested to be involved and several local businesses also have agreed to help. If you know of a local business with at least 10 employees that you think would help, let Debbie Wyatt (270 223-7831) know.

Ongoing needs: men's jeans, belts, and t-shirts; women's bras; socks and shoes for all ages, especially for men and children; toiletry items (shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, disposable razors). It seems we get stocked up on items and we turn around and tubs are empty!

Our livestream has been seeing one issue after another since June—a camera died, the new one required different sound settings, we couldn't figure out the source of background noise—and after weeks of struggle, Aaron came over and suggested a fix within an hour. The sound from August 17th's livestream was the best we've had in a long time!

There's more in the hopper, but that's for next month. Enjoy the warm and golden days of September, and don't say anything to me about pumpkin spice until October arrives!

This is the first in a series of LAMPLIGHTER articles on Stewardship. Our first will be discussing the OPERATING BUDGET of Franklin Presbyterian Church. The Operating Budget consists of PLEDGES, undesignated offerings in worship, and all other gifts not set aside for a specific purpose.

VHO?

Jesus Christ often spoke of wealth and the responsibility to love our neighbors with what we have been given by God. The Apostle Paul echoes this in the way he instructs the church at Corinth to give generously to the church in Jerusalem in 2 Corinthians 9:7-8.

Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not regretfully or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work.

We are blessed by God with great resources at FPC. Using the buildings, the staff, the time and talents of members & friends shows gratitude to God for all we have been given!

The Operating Budget funds the facilities, most of the personnel, as well as basic worship, education, fellowship, and other foundational ministries. As noted, this is funded primarily by Pledges & Offerings.

Clothes Closet, Christian Service, Matthew 25, and Living Waters all have Designated Funds which they use to run and support their ministries & missions.

The Bold Approach is ONLY used for Ministry & Mission programs and projects, including the additional personnel costs related to connecting, creating, and supporting them.

Knowing the amount of money that is pledged helps the budget be built. See below to find out more about how the past two years of Pledging has gone. If you have questions, ask Bob Thompson!
