What Ten Commandments?

God brought the Hebrews out of bondage in Egypt and provided new bonding for them as free people—not free of all limits, but free under a new order. Behind them was the chaos of slavery—ahead of them the creativity of divine relationship.

At Mount Sinai God gave them Ten Commandments, providing a pattern for them to love God and love each other. Much later Jesus told the rich young ruler (Matthew 19:16) "If you would enter life, keep the commandments."

It was by grace that God rescued the Hebrews, not by their own work. The Ten Commandments are also a gracious construction, providing shape to faithful life. Christians are saved by God's grace alone, but we are saved for faithful living along the way.

Shall we say that the Ten Commandments are not walls around us, but a floor beneath us? And as we make our way through the world are they not the path?

Beginning Sunday, October 8 at 9:30 am the Adult Sunday School class will explore the commandments, considering how we shall not live.
