Making Connections

In the air today I can feel that summer is coming—and it's not just the cicadas. There's a weight to the warmth of the sunshine that I welcome every year. Summer is my favorite season, harking back to my upbringing in Florida, but I've grown accustomed to the cyclical changes in daylight and temperature in the more temperate climes I've called home. Spring is becoming summer, and I know fall will come in its time.

It's a nice metaphor for an aspect of the life of faith I've been thinking about a lot this year. Following Jesus asks a lot of us: inner and outer attitudes, particular orientations to strangers and family, willingness to sacrifice and to be led. It can be overwhelming, and it can often feel like things, always trusting that God meets no matter what we're doing, we're neglecting something else—focusing on our individual spirituality instead of loving the world, serving our neighbors

instead of growing our own relationship with God, praying instead of working, working instead of studying Scripture... But I think that these things can also come in seasons: Sow seeds in one season to reap in another; let something lie fallow for a season to plant in another. And just as summer always comes after spring, and spring always follows winter, so we may have a season of more quiet, inwardlyfocused spiritual work, followed bu more outward connection, and so on.

What season are you in? What do you think might be next to you? I invite you to Sunday School this summer to explore that a little. We'll try some interior things and some exterior us in each thing we try and speaks to us in the wisdom of our community. It'll be fun.
