#### SUMMER OF LOVE

Be a part of the Summer of Love ---no, not the 1960s version! I John 4:8 says. "Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love." All sounds right. But what exactly does that mean to you and me? Together, we will explore five ways to love God, through loving our friends, our community, our family, our God, and finally, our enemies. This could mean praying for them, forgiving them, or even showing them kindness in small ways.

With all the things happening around us and too many voices telling us what it all means, it becomes hard to put on our loving faces for everyone to see. Many of us find ourselves stressed out, concerned about what might happen next. It seems like there is something new every day, and we haven't been able to process yesterday's news, much less anything more. So, what are you and I to do?

Perhaps one response is to be a safe place where anyone can come and know they are wanted and included. No judgment, no preaching, just being present for one another. That is what we are called to be, present for others, even when they don't agree with how we feel or think.

We need to move past the "issues" and see the people. People like you and me. People who have a heartbeat, a body, and a soul, just like you and me. Behind every issue or cause is a human being. We must remember that, so we can begin to love others as we love ourselves. We are all made from the same ingredients. We are all loved by the same God, redeemed by the same Savior, Jesus Christ, and all receive the same promise of forgiveness and acceptance. God does not love Jesus more than you. God does not love Jesus more than he loves your enemy. God just loves.

Paul, in his letter to the Galatians, addresses an issue that was causing division in the church at that time. He said it best, and I summarize some of chapter five, "Mark my words, I Paul, tell you, that <u>the only thing</u> that matters is faith working itself out through love! The only thing that matters is love working itself out in faith. Not the intellectual part of faith, but the practical, everyday aspects of faith - we, as a church, living our lives trusting God's grace and showing that through acts of kindness. It may not be the answer to all the issues of the day, but it is guaranteed to give you a more peaceful life, one focused on loving our God and our neighbor as we love ourselves.

Know you are loved, always and unconditionally, by the God who is love.
