AND, we met with the principal and vice principal of the Jucanya Elementary School in Barrio Jucanya, Panajachel to talk carefully and ask and answer questions about our hopes, needs, and capabilities. Praise be to God that after almost eight hours of meetings, we have signed a covenant with the Jucanya Elementary School and will be returning in the spring to install a purification system together! We truly feel that the Holy Spirit has been at work preparing the ground for this partnership.

CLOTHES CLOSET UPDATE

The Matthew 25 Clothes Closet continues to thrive, due to our wonderful community support and our outstanding volunteers. October highlights include:

- ♦ Transitioning to our fall and winter clothes
- Setting up our fall clothing section, including Halloween Costumes for both children and adults
- Receiving over 60 Bibles/Devotionals from the Thomas Nelson company. During our Christmas Holiday Shop, everyone will be given a free devotional book. We are looking for someone willing to wrap these for us.
- Doing a presentation to the local Rotary Club about what the Clothes Closet does for our community

We are going to stop accepting clothing donations until January due to an over-abundance of clothing to process. Exceptions include items we ALWAYS need:

- ♦ Men's ieans
- ♦ Tennis shoes
- **♦** Winter coats
- ♦ Children's winter clothing especially 12-18 boys clothing

During late November, we will be getting ready for our Christmas Shop – which means transforming the old kitchen into our holiday store. Clients are able to get gifts for their family. Last year our church provided so much that we likely have enough for this year. Later, a sign-up sheet will be put up for people to sign up to help out in the Christmas Shop. It takes 2 people and they can't be pulled from our regular workers – especially on Tuesday.

Once again, we will be participating in our annual "Undie Sunday". A laundry basket will be placed near our Christmas tree and each Sunday in December we will ask for donations of underwear. Next month, we will highlight the sizes we are most in need of.




